April is Distracted Driver Awareness month, and law enforcement Officers around the State will be making an extra effort to ticket those drivers who risk their safety and the safety of others. Between April 1st, and April 30th, Officers will be out looking for unsafe distracted drivers.

Distracted driving is any activity that diverts a person's attention away from the primary task of driving. All distractions endanger driver, passenger, and bystander safety. These distractions include:

- Texting
- Using a cell phone or smartphone
- Eating and drinking
- Talking to passengers
- Grooming
- Reading, including maps
- Using a navigation system
- Watching a video
- Adjusting a radio or choosing a song

Remind your friends and family: If you're in the driver's seat, it's the only thing you should be doing. No phone calls, no texts, no eating food, or doing anything that distracts you from driving.

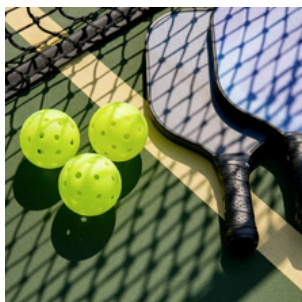

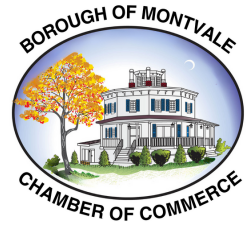
